Orientation 1 - First Nations Education Governance System

Context:

FNEC member communities are unanimous in their commitment to the establishment of First Nations education governance systems that reflect their needs, cultures and aspirations. The validation and implementation of smart quality standards in the following fields, governance and leadership, planning, performance measurement and risk management, financial management, human resource management, information management and information technology, parental and community involvement, external relations, will serve to strengthen educational systems, support transparent and accountable governance, and generally enhance the governance capacities of communities.

During fiscal year 2013-2014, the *Supporting Strong First Nation Education Governance: Standards guide* was developed in collaboration with representatives and experts from FNEC-member communities. This guide was the first step. Communities can now self-assess their governance capacities in relation to collective standards and develop strategic plans to achieve them. The FNEC will support this work.

Additional standards including special education, certification of education staff, language instruction, and capital and infrastructure management, will follow in years to come.

The development and evaluation of activities is important to provide member communities with tools to facilitate and improve their practices.

Implementation considerations:

- The FNEC is a First Nations education association of eight nations and twenty-two First Nations communities;
- The FNEC's governing body, the General Assembly, is formed of representatives from each of the 22 member communities;
- The FNEC has 30 years of expertise in the field of First Nations education;
- FNEC-member communities want to have a system of governance that reflects their aspirations;
- The FNEC supports local and regional improvement of educational systems.

- Offer advice and support related to the use of accounting software.
- Develop tools and training on requirements related to financial reports for new resources or those already employed (professional development).

- Relevant services in support of accountability will be available.
- Relevant training will be provided.
- Schools and communities will have access to services that facilitate accountable and transparent management.
- Schools and communities will better manage their resources to optimum effect.
